RIPPER CLAIMS ANOTHER VICTIM

Jack the Ripper has come back.

He made his latest appearance, to one person at least, some time Friday night, when Minnie Wise, a young negro woman, was knocked in the head, dragged some distance, and her throat cut in a lonely field on Connally street, near Georgia avenue, the same locality where two other women have been murdered. The body was found by a child living in the neighborhood.

The woman's shoes were cut from her feet, a characteristic that marked the murder of Sadie Holley some months ago, and in addition, the right index finger of the Wise woman was hacked off at the middle joint. The police are frankly at a loss to explain the mutilation.

For some hours yesterday the identity of the woman was unknown. It was reported she was Mary King, and the King woman's husband was arrested. He was later released when Mary turned up safe and sound. No other arrests have been made so far.

Friday night's atrocity is the eleventh that has occurred in the city since the regularity of the series was first marked last June. While not generally crediting the theory of a "Jack the Ripper," only one man has been held by the police for trial in connection with any of the murders.
