

Negro Woman Found In the Chattahoochee With Shot in Back

The body of an unidentified negro woman was found entangled in a wire that was holding a fish net to the Cobb county side of the Chattahoochee river, about 1 o'clock yesterday afternoon, by W. L. Rogers.

When Rogers discovered the body, about a mile below Bolton, he immediately notified the Fulton and Cobb county authorities. Officers Gates, Lyle, Swords and Allen, of the Fulton force, answered the call.

An investigation of the body disclosed the fact that the woman had been shot through the back.

The coroner of Cobb county took charge of the body and will hold an inquest today.
